



Lots of money has been given to help at-risk children and children in gangs, to help them get jobs in the future.

70,000 pounds have been given to a charity in Derby to help 14 to 16 year olds get out of gangs and to also help at-risk children by giving them special lessons that include workshops, support classes and holiday courses, this is also related to the JET building that people spend 250,000 pounds on refurbishing.
