

## Learning Activities WEEK 8

### Age Range: Year 4

The aim is for you to complete a minimum of two hours of learning a day with your child. Alongside daily recommended activities for Reading, Writing, Spelling and Maths, class teachers have set a **weekly 'To-Do' list** of activities on [Purple Mash](#) (your child will have individual login to access this).

<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. <a href="#">Times Tables Rock Stars</a> – complete your set times table task.</li><li>2. <a href="#">Prodigy Maths</a> – complete your set task.</li><li>3. <b>Perimeter</b> - Following on from last week's work on perimeter we shall be continuing to make sure you are secure on this and previous learning in school from this year. AT points in these teacher led lessons you will need to pause the video parts to complete tasks in your books. <a href="#">Activity 1</a> – How to measure perimeter, follow each step of instructions that the teacher, Mr Critchlow gives you. It will be the same for each of the following lessons too. <a href="#">Activity 2</a> – learn to draw shapes with different perimeters lesson. <a href="#">Activity 3</a> – Convert between units of measurements lesson. <a href="#">Activity 4</a> – Learn what composite shapes are and how to calculate their perimeter. <a href="#">Activity 5</a> – Consolidation (recalling your skills learnt this week) of perimeter and composite shapes.</li></ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Complete a <a href="#">Bug Club</a> activity x 3.</li><li>2. Complete the '<b>Layers of the Ocean</b>' comprehension sheets also on the drop down menu. If you are in Mr Pearce's or on Mrs Sugden's red or tables, please complete the * sheet; if on the orange or white table the ** sheet and the green or Blue tables, the *** sheet. Answers are on the last page for parents to use. You can print out or just use screen if you can!</li><li>3. <b>60 Second Speed Read 'Making a Longhouse'</b> – set a timer for 1 minute. How far can you read in that time, do you restart? Write it down on the sheet or in your book next to the title, perhaps at the back of your book on the inside cover to keep a record. Then answer the questions, writing out the questions with full sentence answers.</li></ol>
Weekly Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<p><a href="#">Crystal Explorers</a> – this is a fab game from BBC Bitesize. When you enter, choose the spelling option. Choose your character and collect crystals until a very large crystal appears. Click for your character to land on this and then your challenges appear, again click on spelling. Complete the spelling questions. Then restart to collect more crystals. You can come back to this as your progress is saved!</p> <p><a href="#">Silent letters</a> – watch the clip. There are 2 activities to complete over 2 days in the folder saved as 'Silent letters activity sheet'. Activity 1 is page 1 and Activity 2 is pages 2-3. These can be printed or copied into your books.</p>	<p><a href="#">Using Similes and Metaphors</a> – Read and then watch the two BBC Bitesize clips and follow the lesson in order. There are 4 activities.</p> <p><b>Activity 1</b> – Click start and write either simile or metaphor then click check, next you can write 3 or 4 sentences using examples like the one they show. Again, click check. Can you write some more into your books?</p> <p><b>Activity 2</b> – Change the simple sentences to have similes or metaphors and write them into your books.</p> <p><b>Activity 3 Part 1</b> – Draft a poem using similes and Metaphors. Look at the example. You can pick your own theme, be creative! Think of a title. Edit for spellings and layout. What does a poem look like on a page? What does each line begin with?</p> <p><b>Activity 3 Part 2</b> – final draft and illustrate. Perform it to your parents.</p> <p><b>Activity 4</b> – Simile and Metaphor quiz. It is loud so you will need to turn the sound down a little - Have fun!</p>
