

Learning Activities WEEK 11

Age Range: Year 3

The aim is for you to complete a minimum of two hours of learning a day with your child. Alongside daily recommended activities for Reading, Writing, Spelling and Maths, class teachers have set a **weekly 'To-Do' list** of activities on [Purple Mash](#) (your child will have individual login to access this).

| Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day) | Weekly Reading Tasks |
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| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Fraction Matcher – Choose the 'fractions' option. Children have to find pairs of equivalent fractions and put them on the scales. E.g finding two ways to show $\frac{1}{2}$. Daily 10 – Choose level 3, fractions, decimal equivalents of $\frac{?}{10}$. They need to write the given fraction as a decimal – to do this they divide the numerator (top number) by the denominator (bottom number). E.g $\frac{2}{10}$ would be 0.2. Choose 7 or 10 seconds depending on your child's speed. Bitesize Daily Maths - This lesson is about comparing two fraction. Read through the information and examples then complete the 3 activities. If you do not have a printer the children can do the working out in their book/ or paper. Times Tables Rock Stars – complete your set times table task. Prodigy Maths – complete your set task. | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Read the information online about why the Queen has two birthdays. Answer these questions. Online resources <ol style="list-style-type: none"> When is the Queen's real birthday? Who is in the photo that was taken on the 1st May 1926? Which King started off the tradition of having two birthdays? How does the Queen celebrate her actual birthday? What celebration has been cancelled this year due to the corona virus? What happens during Trooping the Colour? How many soldiers, horses and musicians are involved in the Trooping the Colour? Continue your activities on Bug Club and reading books. |
| Weekly Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day) | Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day) |
| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Look Cover Write Check – choose Y3/4 tab, click patterns, choose 'in'. A fun game where you are shown the word, it is covered up and you type the word in. Spooky Spellings - Choose year 3&4, and then book number 7 from the shelf. Children have to look at the word, and then spell it correctly. Learn the spelling list from Spelling Frame: choose Year 3 & 4, click on Spelling Rule 10 – Endings that sound like '-sion'. Practise the words from the activity above using Look, Cover, Write, Check format. Write some of the words from activity 3 into sentences that make sense. Ask your parent or carer to test your words from activity 3 & 4. | <p>Watch the video on Literacy Shed called Upstairs, downstairs. then complete the following tasks, 1 a day.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Write a timetable for the Maggie's working day. Write a letter from Maggie to her parents telling them all about work and how she feels about it. Write a diary entry as Maggie, talking about a typical day at work Write dialogue between Maggie and the older maid in the pink dress. Draw a picture of Maggie and the maids serving the Victorian banquet. |
