


Discuss your answer with an adult, make sure you give a reason why you like that type of weather.

This is the front cover. What are your initial thoughts?





So, what is an expanded noun phrase?

An expanded noun phrase tells us more about the noun!

What is a noun?

Tell some examples to an adult. CLUE: A noun can be a person, a place or an object!

WATCH VIDEO ON BBC BITESIZE: (What is an expanded noun phrase? - BBC Bitesize)

Read the following notes to your child, can they give an example of an expanded noun phrase?

One of the easiest ways to expand a noun phrase is to add an adjective before the noun:

'a young man' 'the blue butterfly'

To expand the noun phrase further, we can add another adjective:

'a young, handsome man'

'the beautiful, blue butterfly'

However, when we use more than one adjective we must use a comma.

You can also expand a noun phrase by adding a preposition (information about where or when something is). For example:

- The boy on the ground was crying.
- The bird in the tree sang every morning.
- The man in the moon looked down at the Earth

Expanded noun phrases help us to make our writing more detailed and specific. Without these, our writing would be more difficult to understand and not as interesting.
