

Queen Victoria's real name was Alexandrina Victoria. She was born in 1819 and became Queen in 1837, just weeks after her 18th birthday. She had nine children with her husband, Prince Albert, over 16 years. She lived for 81 years (63 years as Queen) and died in 1901.

Below are the children she had with Prince Albert:

- Prince Albert Edward Wettin (1841-1910)
- Princess Alice Maude Mary (1843-1878)
- Prince Alfred Ernest Albert (1844-1900)
- Princess Helena Augusta Victoria (1846-1923)
- Princess Louise Caroline Alberta (1848-1939)
- Prince Arthur William Patrick (1850-1942)
- Prince Leopold George Duncan (1853-1884)
- Princess Beatrice Mary Victoria (1857-1944)

What is a Family Tree?

A family tree is a type of chart or diagram representing generations of families and how they are linked throughout the years.

A family tree can include names, birth dates, marriage dates and pictures. Family trees can be simple and just include your close family members, or they can go back many generations to enable you to see where you came from, who your ancestors were and how you are related to them.

Family trees are also a good visual representation of how closely you are related to a member of your family. For example, you will be able to see that you are more closely related to your sister than your cousin, as you are closer to them on the family tree.
