Course outline and assessment:

WJEC Eduqas GCSE Geography B aims to enable learners to think 'like a geographer'. Students will develop the ability to think creatively, by posing questions that relate to a geographical process and develop the ability to think scientifically by collecting and recording appropriate evidence from a range of sources, including fieldwork. They will also develop the ability to think independently by applying geographical knowledge, understanding, skills and approaches appropriately and creatively to real world contexts.

Students will be assessed through three exams at the end of year 11.

Paper 1 - Investigating geographical issues which includes Changing Economies, Changing Environments and Environmental Challenges.

Paper 2 - Problem Solving Geography
